



Thank you to everyone who stepped to the plate to be our club officers. Club awards were given out and recognition to those who went above and beyond to make last year's season another great year.

In May the club once again volunteered to help with the Trail Mix Run. It was pouring rain but the club volunteers waded it out and helped the runners get across busy streets and provided a water station. Proceeds from this run go to Reach for a Star Riding Academy. This program provides horseback riding lessons to disabled children.


We have started an in house scholarship; we are just in the beginning stages of getting a fund together to get it started. One way we have been raising some funds is doing a 50/50 raffle at the Casper Speedway Races. We were able to do 3 nights, and raised \$916.50. We will once again be raffling off a pig to be spit by two winners. Details about how we will be awarding the scholarship are still being worked on, but we are excited to see it come to life.

For the first time we helped host Moto Dayz or an Octane Addiction show here at our fairgrounds. This took a lot of planning and a lot of volunteers. Proceeds will in part be given to a child with cancer and his family to take a needed vacation. We are still working on how much was raised, but we would like to thank all of our sponsors, donors and volunteers! Thank you to Cole and Ashley as they had put a lot of time and heart putting this together and getting the club involved in making it happen.

With a few club members Dave, Martin, Brion Peterson, Dena Richardson, Karen and Phil Santistevan, Londell Terry, and Becky Thorne a few mountain land owners, Doug Irvine, Tracy Lamont, Gary Cosby, Greg Prestone and finally Parks Board member Dave North. We are still waiting for the final approval of design for shelter but we are feeling optimistic with getting the outhouse done after seven years.

Upcoming events include a Halloween Party in October, Bingo Night and Christmas Parade in November and Christmas Party in December. 

Hello again everyone from the Dubois Snow Katters

The fall colors are beginning to pop in the Upper Wind River, and we have seen our first snow of the year up on the Continental Divide. We hope you all have had great summer with all of your dirt and water toys, and best of luck if you're setting out on some fall hunting adventures.

Remember to start looking at the sleds in your shops and trailers to make sure all of the little things are taken care of. I like to grease the suspension and steering parts using a low temp, water proof grease. Look over the ski carbides and replace those that are wore out or damaged. Adjust track tension on the machines that need it, look at coolant levels, and change out the chain case oil annually. Drive belts and clutches are next, I always start the year off with a new belt and move my old one into the spare slot, and at a minimum blow the primary clutch out with about 90 psi. If your like me, you probably have some body parts stitched together with zip ties or tie wire, and depending on the location and what it may be connected to, it might not be a bad time to replace it or put a more permanent fix on them so things don't break out worse half way into the new season. I move all my old gas out of the sleds and into the lawn mowers and snow blowers, and end with a nice sponge bath to let them know how much you care.

The best thing about pre season maintenance is by the time you work through it all, you are really jacked up and race ready...about two months early.

Looking forward to seeing you all on the mountain, until then, try and hold it together, will ya?
