Just when I thought that mother nature was going to bless Wyoming with snow, she decides to send snow to locations of the US that never get snow. She sure is being fickle this year. While I know that it is supposedly still wintertime it is hard to remember that when the temperatures are in the middle 50s. Maybe we will get in some good springtime riding. We could only hope right?

I hope that you all got letters of support sent into your legislators on SF0005 – Legislation that would allow State Parks to purchase the field office and shop in Lander. As well as HB0008 which is legislation for Scratch Tickets for outdoor recreation funding. As you all know it is important to stay engaged with our club members as well as legislation that could affect us around the state.

Let's not forget to keep our eyes on Federal Legislation that is coming down the pike. First there is the Northern Rockies Ecosystem Protection Act, HR1755. This legislation targets the lands in Idaho, Montana, Oregon, Washington, and Wyoming. It would prohibit any new road construction or reconstruction or timber harvest without an act of Congress. Oil or gas leasing, mining, or other development which impairs the natural and roadless qualities of the land is also prohibited. This legislation would take all inventoried roadless systems and make them part of the Wilderness System. That is about 23 million acres which is where we recreate!

Then there is the Biden Administration 30x30 Program also called the "American the Beautiful" program which aims to set aside 30% of the nation's lands and waters in a natural state by 2030. A group of Senate Democrats are urging the administration to accelerate progress on its conservation pledge by granting provisional wilderness designations to public lands. They now want the Bureau of Land Management to update its inventories of public lands to find and set aside areas with "wilderness characteristics". Remember that only Congress can release lands from a WSA, opening them to other purposes like mining, or they can permanently restrict the WSA as wilderness.

So much happening legislatively in Wyoming and at the Federal level it is hard to keep up.

Last month I wrote about the American Council of Snowmobile Associations and how important they are for all of the states across the snowbelt. They are our watchdog for happenings in Washington D.C. and other
