



Overall, It was a relatively slow summer of events for the Club.



Later in June, annual maintenance at Strawberry included replacing the original wood buck fence with a custom-made metal buck fence built by Roy Barney. The original fence was removed from the shelter when the shelter was wrapped to protect it during the Pack Trail Fire in 2024.

August: The August fun run in the Upper Green starting at Kendall Valley Lodge; most participants drove their UTVs but there were a few dirt bikes and ATVs. Thanks to everyone for being aware and prepared for the extremely dry conditions. Thank you for picking up any garbage you found and not leaving any! This year there were no accidents nor other problems during the ride. (The Dollar Lake Fire started six days later.) Thanks to Sandy at Kendall Valley Lodge for allowing us to take over her lodge while registering folks before they hit the trail.

About 20 volunteers worked at the Blind Bull safety shelter for this year's maintenance. They helped unload and stack firewood, power wash the cabin exterior, lower the height of the grass, attended to the outhouse, and enjoyed a hot meal. Thanks to all who provided supplies, food, muscle, and came to work. Every year the swallows return...to the shelter at Blind Bull.
